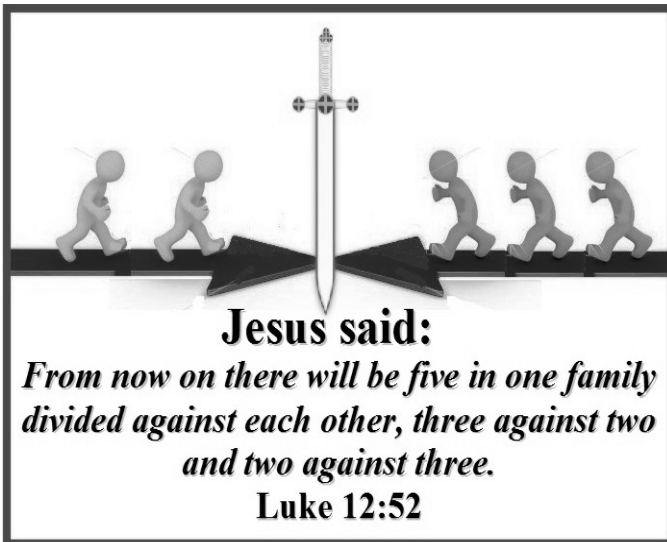

Martyrdom

The Church calendar abounds with many feasts of martyrs of all nations, eras, ages, and circumstances. We venerate them, name our children after them, and love to read their stories. Yet, when martyrdom actually happens in our own time we become frightened, angry, and utterly surprised. Indeed, such responses reduce martyrdom to just another murder, thereby draining the event of its vast spiritual power.

Consider the martyrdom of Fr. Jacques Hamel, the 85-year old French priest who was killed on July 26 by two teenagers who had pledged their allegiance to ISIS. How does one react to such an atrocious killing? Retaliation? Hatred of people who follow other religious? Barbed wire? Not at all. Rather, the Lord prescribed joy!

We cannot avoid his clear -- and shocking -- words: *“Blessed are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven”* (Matthew 5:11). Though martyrdom inevitably produces grief and lamentation, it always should culminate in rejoicing. That’s why the feast days of martyrs always resound with triumphant joy.

Now, let’s consider the shock and surprise that frequently accompany martyrdom in our times. Why are Catholics so stunned when such atrocities happen? After all, on multiple occasions Jesus bluntly foretold the inevitability of martyrdom. Moreover, he put no time limit on the “age of martyrdom.” It happens everywhere, in every era, and in many different ways, some bloody, others not. Surprise, then, makes no sense.

Over 40 years ago, Joseph Ratzinger, who became Pope Benedict XVI, wrote a beautiful little reflection about martyrdom. Drawing on the writings and personal experience of St. Ignatius of Antioch, an outstanding bishop/martyr of the 1st century, Ratzinger noted that the term “Christian” always signified active participation in an illegal conspiracy.

“The name Christian,” he wrote, *“implies fellowship with Christ, and hence the readiness to take upon oneself martyrdom in the cause of goodness. Christianity is a conspiracy to promote the good.”*

What would Fr. Jacques Hamel want us to think about the brutal event of July 26 in Rouen? His sister Roselyne gave us some clues. First, she revealed that during the French war against the Algerian independence movement, young Jacques Hamel, a French soldier, refused to become an officer. Why? To avoid ordering anyone to kill anyone else. *“His refusal was categorical,”* Roselyne said. *“He chose to serve God so that he could cultivate love and sharing and tolerance among people of all faiths and denominations, believers and unbelievers, throughout his life. Let us learn to live together. Let us be the workers and artisans of peace.”*

Fr. Jacques Hamel belonged to *“a conspiracy to promote good.”* And Ratzinger, all the way back in 1975, ominously warned, *“Fellowship with Christ signifies to the eyes of the world a participation in a conspiracy punishable by death.”*

The death sentences imposed on “the conspirators of good” are always evidence of spiritual power, not weakness; a cause for rejoicing and hope, not retribution and gloom.
