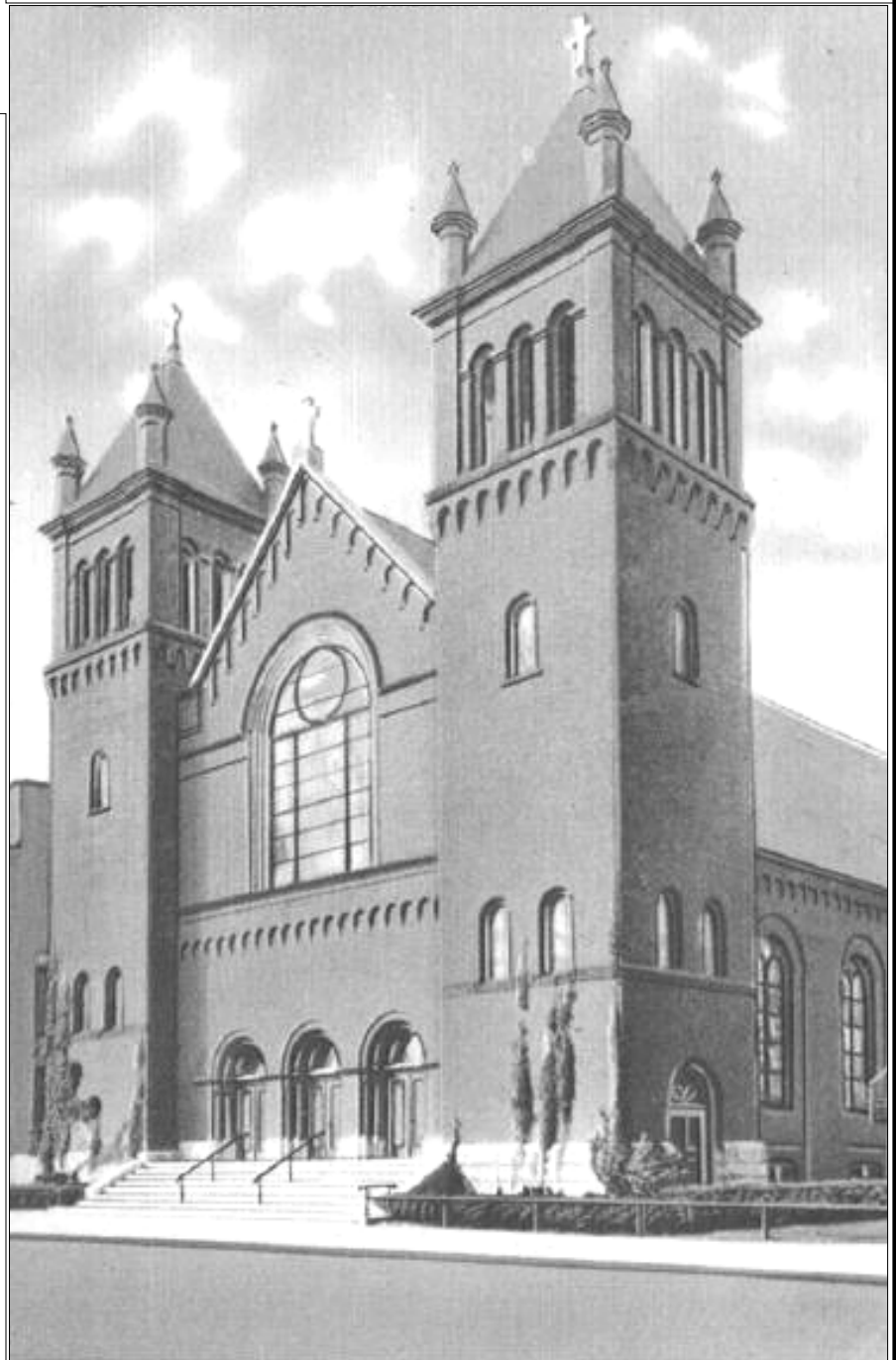

CORPUS CHRISTI FOOD PANTRY

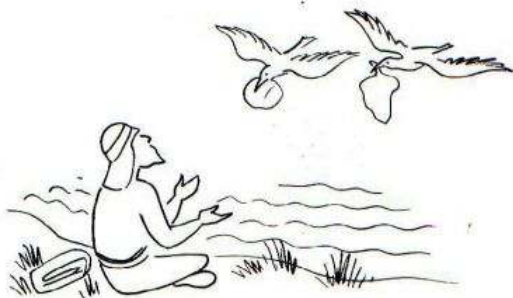

St. Francis, St. Clare, Poverty and Money

Next Wednesday, August 11, the Church will celebrate the memory of St. Clare of Assisi (1193-1253), the young noble woman who left her affluent family to join the small band of men who were following St. Francis. Her flight from her wealthy family set off a huge controversy because she had rejected marriage and – even worse – a share in her family’s wealth. Indeed, she found St. Francis so appealing precisely because of his radical poverty. The Roman Missal’s opening prayer for St. Clare draws attention to her “love of poverty.”

As much as Catholics revere St. Francis, St. Clare, St. Anthony of Padua, and other primitive Franciscans, we find their “love of poverty” strange, obsolete, and even dangerous. To get a clearer sense of how radical St. Francis was, we need to look at his “First Rule,” written in 1209. Read the following “laws” from St. Francis:

None of the friars should ever carry or receive money or coin – not even for clothing, books, or in payment for some kind of labor.

If a friar even chances across money somewhere, he should give it no more regard than if it were dust.

St. Francis, always known for gentleness, imposed a harsh punishment on any friar who dared to keep money: *All the brothers should consider him an apostate, thief, robber, like the one who kept that purse [i.e. Judas!] unless he become truly penitent.*

What accounts for this animosity toward money and option for poverty? Two factors. First, St. Francis, St. Clare, and other early Franciscans, took to heart the example of Christ and His frequent warnings against excessive material wealth. Second, and perhaps more important, they understood that the “neediness” of voluntary poverty fostered a true spirit of gratitude to God, who is the source of everything that they had ever received.

This second point underlies the teaching of Pope Francis expressed in *Laudato Si*. The Holy Father has passionately warned us that the frenetic pursuit of a super-abundance of “stuff” inevitably suppresses the spirit of gratitude, thereby making worship – which is preeminently an act of *thanksgiving* – obsolete, unappealing, and senseless for people smothered by excess.

Contemporary Catholics, of course, must ask a crucial question: Are we *really* expected to take St. Francis and St. Clare as models to be imitated? Yes! Just as the Christian life is supposed to be an “imitation of Christ,” it is also an “imitation of the saints.”

But what does this mean in *actual practice* today? At the very minimum, the example of St. Francis and St. Clare – and the teaching of Pope Francis – should make us uneasy about the excess that may exist in our own lives; it should cause us to take a second look at our attitudes toward poverty, wealth, and accumulation; and it should get us to review our own habits regarding concrete generosity toward the poor and needy, even within our own families.

Perhaps the following lines from the Holy Father’s *Laudato Si* offer the best and most simple direction: *Less is more... Christian spirituality proposes a growth marked by moderation and the capacity to be happy with a little. It is a return to that simplicity which allows us to stop and appreciate small things, to be grateful for the opportunities which life affords us, to be spiritually detached from what we possess, and not to succumb to sadness for what we lack.* For sure, St. Francis and St. Clare would endorse this as a “good translation” of their spirituality.
