

St. Maria Goretti and her executioner: Some thoughts

On July 6, the Catholic Church celebrated the memorial of St. Maria Goretti, a 12-year old girl brutally murdered in 1902 by a pedophile named Alessandro Serenelli. Maria's father had died when she was just 10-years old. Serenelli, who was the son of Mr. Goretti's close friend and business partner, took advantage of the situation and tried to seduce the defenseless girl. Because she repeatedly resisted his advances, he eventually murdered her, stabbing her 14 times.

The story of St. Maria Goretti has two parts – one about her and one about her murderer. The first is well-known; the second is not. The first loses much of its great beauty if the second part is forgotten.

As to the first part, Maria was a simple and devout Catholic girl who lived in an impoverished Italian family. Despite her limited education and unfavorable social conditions, Maria clearly understood the difference between right and wrong, and so resisted – even to the point of death -- Serenelli's attempted seduction. Of itself, Maria's steadfast and heroic defense to her God-given dignity deserves great honor. After all, how many older Catholics would have acted as she did?

Now let's turn to the second part of St. Maria Goretti's story – the situation of her murderer. The evidence against Serenelli, who had actually lived in the same residence as Maria, was indisputable. Hence, he was quickly convicted and imprisoned. Shockingly, Serenelli served less than 26 years for the cold blooded murder of a child! (In many states today Serenelli would have ended up on death row or even executed.)

How could this be? Here's what happened. In his eight years of imprisonment, Serenelli reported having had a dream in which his victim presented him with a bouquet of flowers, a gesture of her forgiveness. Of course, many probably dismissed this "dream" as a clever and cynical scam. However, subsequent developments suggest its authenticity.

Upon the murderer's release in 1928, Maria's mother sought him out, forgave him, and became reconciled with him. Moreover, Mrs. Goretti and Mr. Serenelli attended Christmas Mass and received Holy Communion while kneeling together at the altar rail. Later, Serenelli joined the Third Order of the Capuchin Franciscans and spent the rest of his life doing penance for his act of murder. He died in 1970, 68 years after he had killed a little 12-year old girl whom Pope Pius XII had canonized in 1950. Serenelli actually attended the glorious canonization ceremony, which attracted the largest crowd in the Vatican's history.

Let's consider an unsettling question: Would the Italian state have acted justly if it had executed Serenelli. Yes. He had received a fair trial. The evidence had been conclusive. And the victim had been an innocent and defenseless child. However, the legitimate use of capital punishment would have short circuited the slow and mysterious movement of God's grace, which somehow had become intertwined with the intercession of the victim. If Serenelli had been executed, St. Maria Goretti's story would have ended as just another "solved murder case" with no real spiritual significance. However, by <u>not</u> executing Serenelli, society created space for two saints – the canonized Virgin Martyr and, just possibly, her executioner.

The story of St. Maria Goretti and Alessandro Serenelli affirms the old biblical adage, "God's ways are not man's ways." And it reminds us that by clinging tenaciously to "man's ways," when they seem so just and effective, we may obstruct God's infinite mercy, which always exceeds our understanding.
