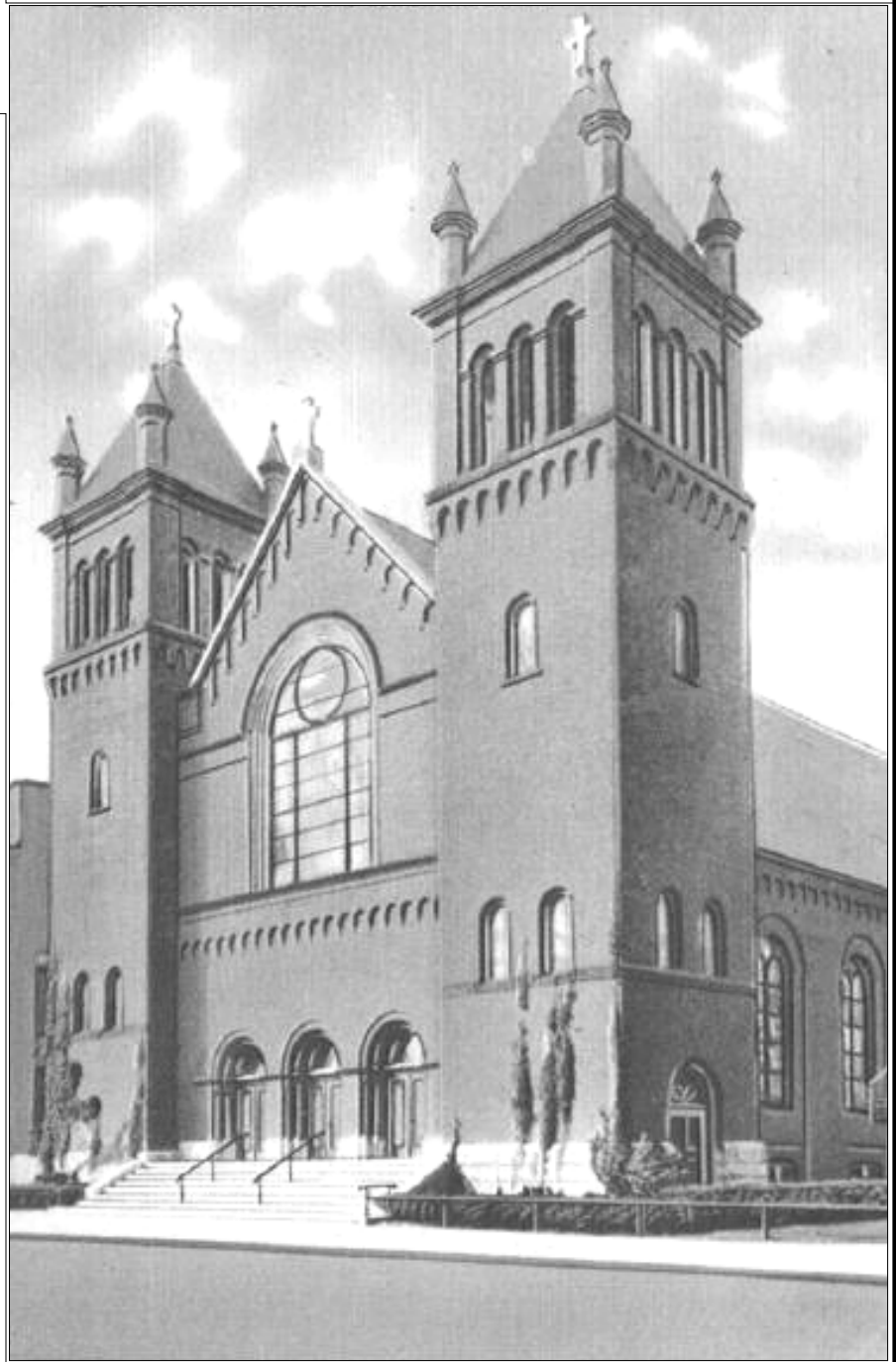

**Fatima Centenary Indulgence**

During the celebration of the 100th anniversary of Our Lady's apparitions in Fatima, Pope Francis has granted a plenary indulgence to people who visit a statue of Our Lady of Fatima solemnly exposed in a church.

The visits are to be made on the anniversary of each apparition, namely the 13th of each month from May to October. The standard conditions for receiving a plenary indulgence apply: 1.) recitation of the Our Father and Creed; 2.) Confession; 3.) reception of Holy Communion; and 4.) prayers for the Holy Father's intentions. In addition, one must pray to Mary under the title Our Lady of Fatima. The plenary indulgence can be applied to the dead and be received every month.

The statue of Our Lady of Fatima is located on the right side of the sanctuary. This statue apparently came from Portugal, was donated to St. Patrick's by a parish member, and was lost in a rectory closet for many years. Our Lady's right hand was missing. The father of Jerry Levesque, our former maintenance man, carefully carved a tiny hand, restoring the statue to its original integrity. The statue will be displayed for veneration until November 26, the conclusion of the Centenary.

## *A Story of Hope from NH Catholic Charities*

Part of the healing process involved reconnecting him with his family. Because of his addiction, most of his family members had stopped talking with him. Now, they better understand his struggle and have seen the progress he's making. William believes he's now "in the right place."

William recently married and now manages a barber shop. William knows that he'll have to continue to work hard to stay substance-free but he has the full support of his wife, family and Catholic Charities as a solid foundation for a happy and future. For the first time in a *very* long time, he has living hope.

## *The Holy Spirit: Breath of God*

When we speak of God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit we easily understand the terms "Father" and "Son." But who -- or what -- is the Holy Spirit?

Consider the act of mouth to mouth resuscitation. When someone collapses and is unable to breathe, someone may rush to the stricken person, put his own mouth on the other person's mouth and begin blowing his own breath into the victim. This breath revives the dying person. In a sense, the "life" of one person enters into the other person and the two "lives" bind themselves together. The Holy Spirit, then, resembles the breath that revives the dying person.

We see this in the Gospel always read on Pentecost. Here we meet the frightened band of Apostles on Easter night. They knew that Jesus had definitely been executed on the cross. They had also heard rumors that he was now alive. They were men filled with guilt, doubt, and uncertainty about their future. In short, they were small and dead community.

Jesus appeared, greeted them, and then immediately did something highly unusual: He blew his breath into their faces, close enough for them to inhale the warm breath that emerged from within his very body. As he breathed on them he said, "Receive the Holy Spirit, whose sins you shall forgive they are forgiven you; whose sins you shall retain, they are retained."

This breath was the very Spirit of God which arose within the Risen Christ and entered into the Apostles individually and collectively. We have here a spiritual "mouth to mouth resuscitation" which revives -- and transforms -- life.

This story of "mouth to mouth resuscitation" appears toward the end of St. John's gospel. And for good reason: It turns our attention back to the very beginning of the Bible where we see a similar act.

The inspired writer of Genesis described the creation of the first human being in the same way. God formed a human figure from dirt. God then bent over and blew the Divine breath into the figure. Only then did the lifeless figure become fully human; only then does life truly begin. Note well: There is no human life without the Spirit. Note well: Humanity and Divinity are joined together by the Divine breath -- the Holy Spirit.

On Pentecost, the final day of the 50-day Easter Season, we celebrate the amazing truth that God dwells within us: individually and collectively. Today, then, we give thanks to God -- Father, Son, and Holy Spirit -- who has graciously given us "mouth to mouth resuscitation," which rescues us from death and gives us everlasting life.
