The warning label on Holy Communion

Almost everything we touch these days has a warning label. We find them on medicine, toys, lawn mowers, amusement park rides, cars, food, and so on. Strange as it may seem, even Holy Communion bears a warning label. It appears in the Roman Missal – the old as well as the new. Most people never see it because only the priest reads it. Here's the text:

*May the receiving of your Body and Blood,
Lord Jesus Christ,
not bring me to judgment and condemnation,
but through your loving mercy
be for me protection in mind and body
and a healing remedy.*

Notice how this prayer, which was written over 1,000 years ago, resembles warnings we see on many medications: A particular substance, for example be a “healing remedy” or lead to the “condemnation” of life-threatening side effects. How so? The ultimate effect of the medication may depend on the quantity taken (too much may kill); the presence of other substances floating through the body (like alcohol or other drugs); and the composition of one's own body (allergies and so on). Every medication, then, is double-sided: it may heal or kill. Likewise this ancient prayer asserts that Holy Communion acts the same way.

But how can the Body and Blood of Christ, which is Goodness itself, act as poison? The answer is clear: By mixing with incompatible substances within us, specifically *sin* – those acts and habits that separate us from God and neighbor. St. Paul was very blunt about this. He sternly warned against receiving Holy Communion while in the state of serious sin and noted: “Many of you are weak and ill and a good number have died” (I Corinthians 11:30). Indeed, as St. Paul insisted, the Sacrament can act as poison!

What specific sins transform Holy Communion into poison? Sacred Scripture doesn't provide a tidy list of sins that preclude receiving Holy Communion. However, Jesus identified one especially grave sin: the refusal of forgiveness to others. During the Sermon on the Mount the Lord said: “*When you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift at the altar and go; first be reconciled with your brother, then come back and offer your gift*” (Matthew 5:23-24). In other words, Jesus warned that holding grudges and refusing forgiveness *makes worship impossible*.

Corpus Christi, the great feast of Holy Communion, is the perfect time to read the “warning label,” to think carefully about the Good One we receive, and to pray that He will always be our “healing remedy.”
