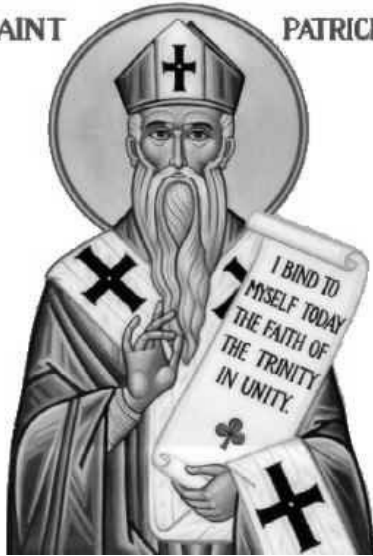

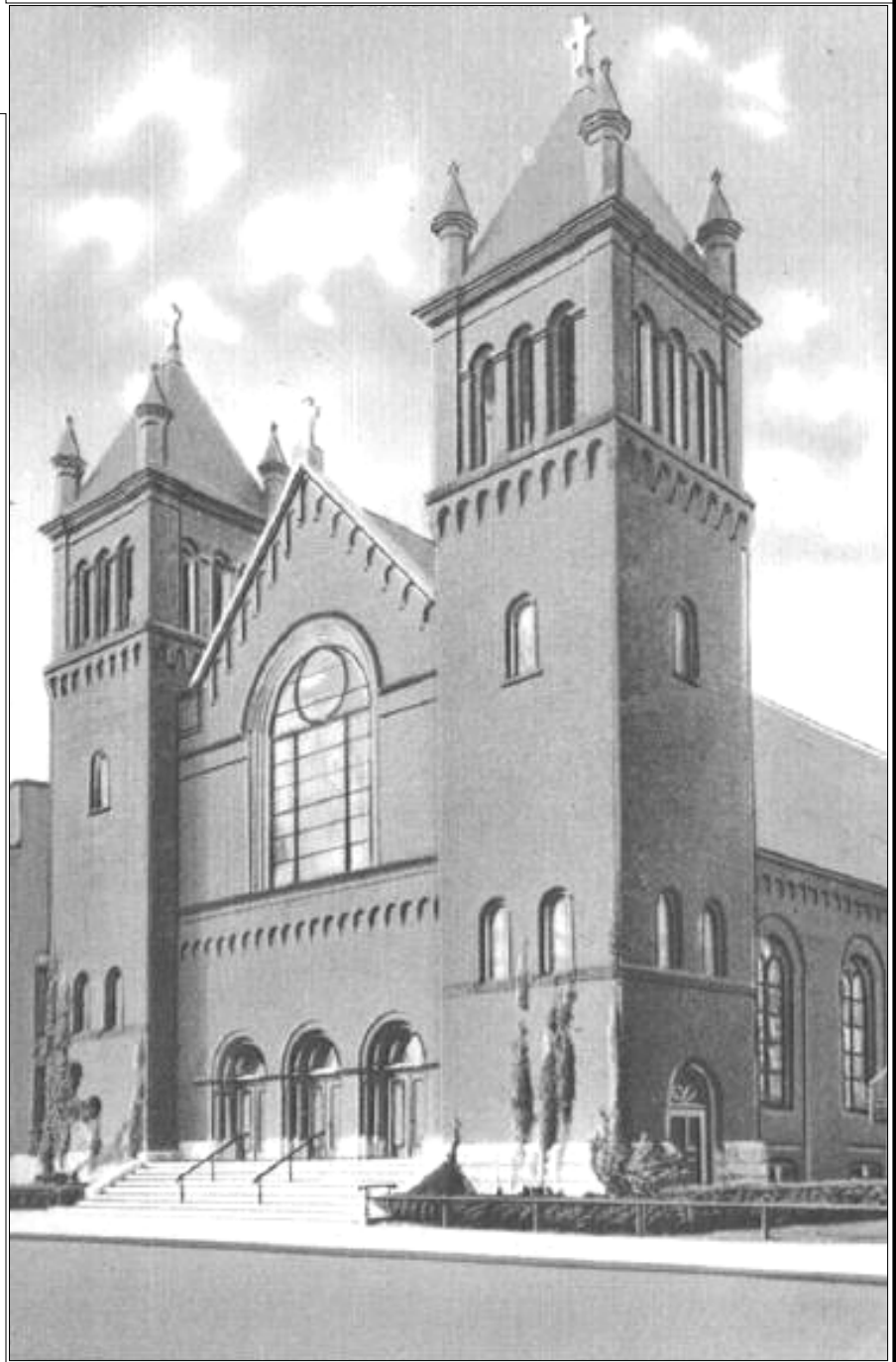

## **Fatima Centenary Indulgence**

During the celebration of the 100th anniversary of Our Lady's apparitions in Fatima, Pope Francis has granted a plenary indulgence to people who visit a statue of Our Lady of Fatima solemnly exposed in a church.

The visits are to be made on the anniversary of each apparition, namely the 13th of each month from May to October. The standard conditions for receiving a plenary indulgence apply: 1.) recitation of the Our Father and Creed; 2.) Confession; 3.) reception of Holy Communion; and 4.) prayers for the Holy Father's intentions. In addition, one must pray to Mary under the title Our Lady of Fatima. The plenary indulgence can be applied to the dead and be received every month.

The statue of Our Lady of Fatima is located on the right side of the sanctuary. This statue apparently came from Portugal, was donated to St. Patrick's by a parish member, and was lost in a rectory closet for many years. Our Lady's right hand was missing. The father of Jerry Levesque, our former maintenance man, carefully carved a tiny hand, restoring the statue to its original integrity. The statue will be displayed for veneration until November 26, the conclusion of the Centenary.

## *Mary and Fatima*

In the realm of God's handiwork is anything merely a coincidence? Consider, Our Lady's choice to appear in Fatima, a small town in Portugal. The size doesn't matter; the town's name does: Fatima was the daughter of Muhammad!

To be precise, the site of the Our Lady's apparition was actually named after Fatima, a 12th century Moorish princess. Recall that Portugal, along with much of Spain, was dominated by the Moors for several hundred years, hence some places still retain Islamic names. For sure, the princess was named after the "original" Fatima, just as girls named Mary are usually named after Our Lady.

Fatima is one of the most important figures in Islamic history. Unlike Muhammad's other children, who died young or had no offspring, Fatima is recognized as the maternal source of Muhammad's descendants through her marriage to Ali, the Prophet's nephew. The Fatimid dynasty, which ruled much of North Africa from the 10th to 12th century, received its name from Fatima.

The Muslims known as Shias (concentrated in Iraq and Iran) greatly revere Fatima, even to the point of considering her entire life miraculous.

Could it be providential, then, that during the centenary of Mary's apparitions in Portugal that her holy Name will be constantly linked with the name Fatima? Can we imagine that millions of Muslims will wonder about the linkage between Mary, the mother of Jesus, and Fatima, the daughter of Muhammad?

This connection is not far fetched. Raymond William Baker, who wrote *One Islam, Many Muslim Worlds* (2015), noted: "Reverential descriptions of Mary in the *Qur'an* exceed the space accorded to her in the New Testament. An entire *surah* entitled 'Maryam' tells the story of Jesus and Mary."

The *surah* strongly affirms the virginal conception of Jesus, as our gospels do; and severely criticizes anyone who suggests that Mary's pregnancy came about through a man (as many Christians allege). Moreover, it even points to Mary's Assumption. In a truncated version of the Magnificat we find Mary saying: "Peace be upon me the day I was born, the day I die, and the day I am raised alive!"

Coincidences? Our Lady first appeared in Fatima on May 13, 1917, less than two months after the abdication of the Russian Tsar. On October 13, 1917, she appeared for the last time. Several days later the Bolsheviks seized control and the totalitarian Soviet regime began. Now, 100 years later, the Soviet state is gone, yet unbelief penetrates into our own homes. Perhaps the prayerful remembrance of Our Lady, whether by Catholics or those who hear the name Fatima linked with her great shrine, will somehow advance God's desire for peace.
