

Trinity

Once a year the Church sets before us the highly complex doctrine of the Trinity: the teaching that there is only one true God, who is Father, Son, and Spirit, three distinct divine persons, yet only one God.

We tend to flee from such complex matters because they seem to be irrelevant. After all, what difference does it really make whether there is one god, five gods, three persons, six persons or no persons?

It actually makes a huge difference because doctrine about God is also doctrine about human beings -- who and what we are. How we understand God affects how we understand ourselves.

If God is an impersonal energy field floating through outer space, then we are aliens to God and God is alien to us. But as Christians we do not worship a "Higher Power." Instead, we worship the Divine, who -- as Father, Son, and Spirit -- exists beyond us, within us, and united to us. The doctrine of the Trinity teaches us that God and Humanity have a deep kinship; each is drawn to the other.

We see this beautifully expressed in a text from Proverbs used on Trinity Sunday in Year C (cf. Proverbs 8:22-31). The speaker here is "Wisdom/Sophia," another name for the Son before He became the human being we call Christ. Wisdom says:

Then was I beside him as his craftsman, and I was his delight day by day, playing before him all the while, playing on the surface of his earth, and I found delight in the human race.

Notice two things here. First, the text uses the word "playing" to describe the relationship between God and Wisdom/Father and Son. We don't often imagine the Divine as "playful," yet here it is: a carefree and joyful leaping, running, frolicking of the Divine across the vast expanse of the universe. We always think of God as old; yet though God is ancient, God is also eternally young for God has no beginning and no end

Second, and even more important, the text says: "I found delight in the human race." The literal translation is: "I found delight with the children of men." The God who plays seeks out human beings -- children -- as "playmates." This reveals us to ourselves: There is something deep within us that attracts Wisdom/Sophia/Christ, the Divine One who delights in us. How amazing to believe that the Divine gazes on us and delights in us!

On Trinity Sunday we celebrate who God is: the Father, the Origin of all, the One who is infinitely beyond us; God who is Spirit, the One who penetrates our very depths, who is nearer to us than we can ever fathom; and God who is Son, the Word made flesh, who joins himself to each of us for ever.

And so we hail the Divine as One God: Father, Son, and Spirit; and we rejoice to know that because we spring from God as our origin, God forever delights in us as friends, as His own beloved children.
