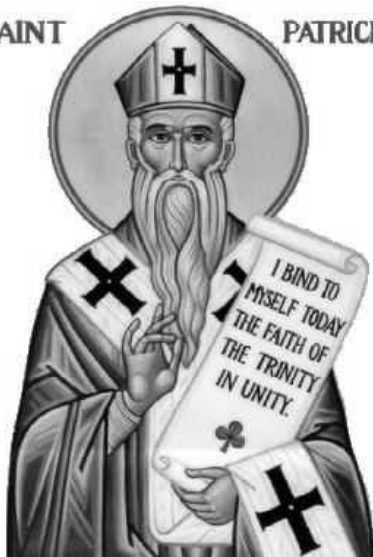

Saints, heavenly relatives, and cemeteries

In the 7th century the Church created All Saints Day to draw attention to the vast assembly of all deceased people, known and unknown, who already dwell in God's Presence in Heaven. This feast also corrects the dangerous tendency to assume that sainthood is very rare. This notion arose as the term "saint" became attached exclusively to people who had been "canonized" – formally inscribed on the list of official saints. This complex process serves a very good purpose: the authority of the Church *assures* us that specific people are *definitely* in Heaven, thereby providing us with certified intercessors who can join their prayers to ours in God's Presence.

Though we should never presume that anyone other than canonized saints are *definitely* in Heaven, we can reasonably assume that at least some of our deceased relatives, friends, and benefactors (and even enemies!) have reached their final goal. Moreover, they know us and care about us.

St. Bernard of Clairvaux, the great Benedictine abbot, made this precise point in a sermon preached on All Saints Day in the 12th century. He noted that the purpose of the feast is to encourage us to look up toward Heaven as our true homeland, a place that already contains loved ones. He said this:

"The saints lovingly call us and we make little of it; the host of the redeemed look for us and we are not interested. Let us shake off our torpor, and rise with Christ to seek the things that are above, to set our minds on things above. Let us love those who love us, hasten to those who await us, and with our prayers come into the presence of those who are looking for us."

What an astounding thought! Even as saints gaze upon God in ecstatic happiness, they "are looking for us," hoping that we will "make it" and be reunited with them at the end of our lives. The Preface of the Eucharistic Prayer for All Saints reinforces this notion of "*spiritual solidarity*" between the living and dead by speaking of the saints as "*the great array of our brothers and sisters*" already occupied with the eternal praise of God.

The Church has a crucial instrument to promote this "*spiritual solidarity*" – cemeteries. I came to a more vivid understanding of this a few years ago while in Ireland. I had gone to Ballyhaunis, a small place in Mayo where some relatives still live and where my mother had spent part of her childhood. I had an hour to kill before the next train to Dublin, so I walked up a road near the station and wandered into a cemetery. I thought to myself that perhaps Uncle Martin, my grandmother's youngest brother, might be buried there. I knew he had died years before, but had no information. I thought it unlikely that I'd ever find his grave.

After walking a few yards, I stopped, glanced around a bit, looked down, and there he was: Martin O'Grady. I then noticed that he had died just a few days before my mother. I had met him only twice – in 1975 and 1977. (Some relatives told that he had always remembered me because I had given him and his son a bottle of Bushmill's.) I said a prayer for him, then spent some time walking through the cemetery looking at headstones, many of them from the early 19th century. Quite a few had names I knew were of my family – Philips, O'Grady, Greeley, Finn, and others. I suddenly realized that many of these people were my ancestors, most of whom I had never known but who were known to my mother, grandparents and other blood relatives. And then I thought to myself, "Surely, some of these must be in Heaven, they must be saints." And, if I am to believe what St. Bernard said long ago, perhaps some of them are actually looking for me, and praying that I too "make it."
