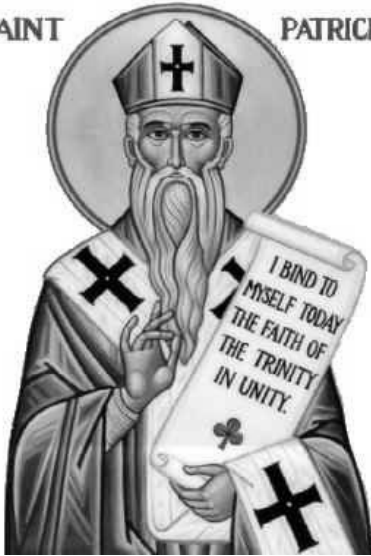

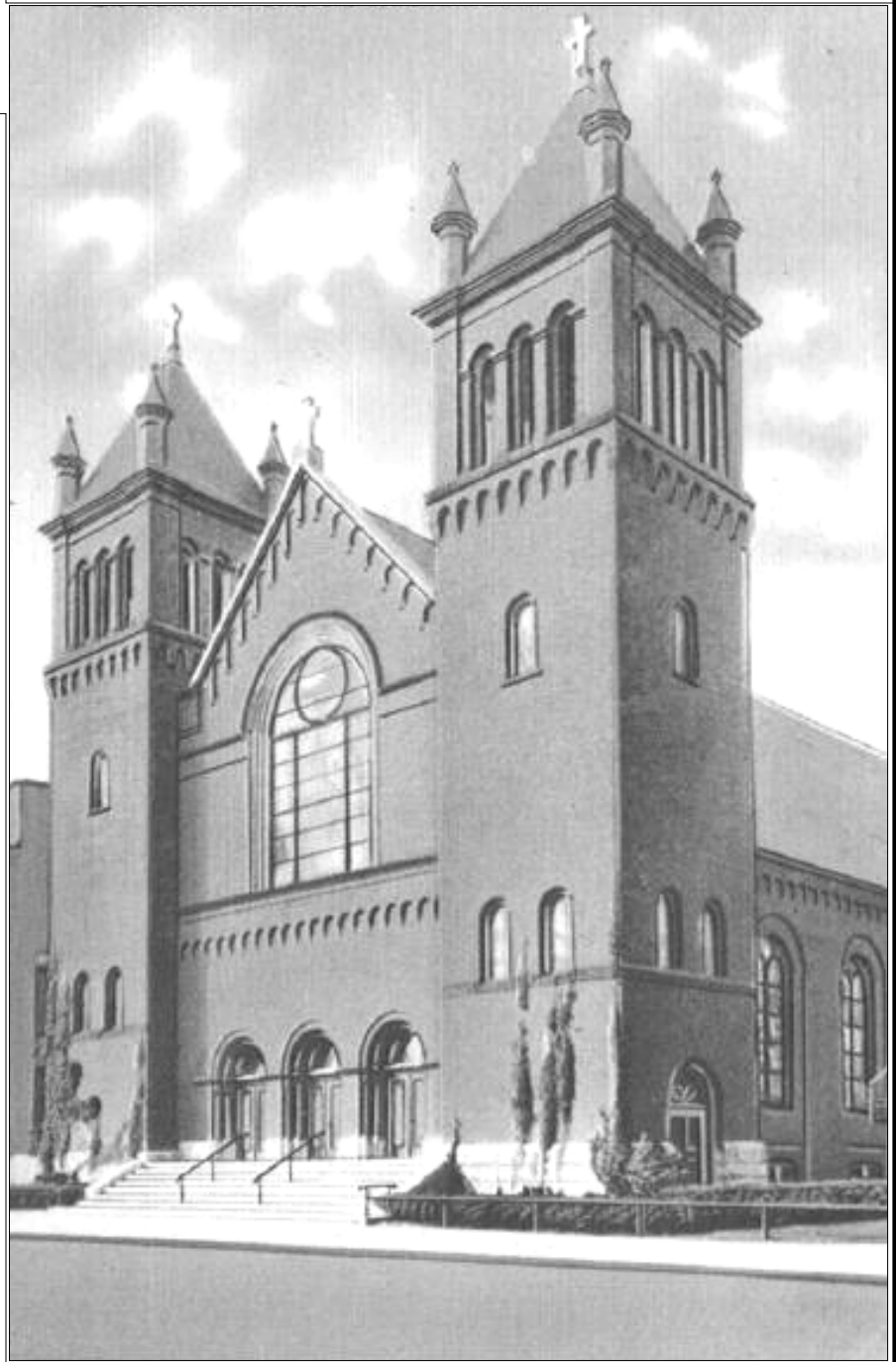

HANDICAPPED ACCESSIBLE CONFESSIONAL

The newly built handicapped accessible confessional will be installed and ready for use by the weekend of December 5/6. The new confessional will replace Fr. Kerper's confessional and match the same color and style of Fr. Healey's confessional. The new confessional will be slightly larger than the existing one, and will have one large penitent section. The walls, doors and window include sound dampening materials. The large penitent section has room for a wheel chair to turn around, a pull-down seat for those having difficulty kneeling, and a kneeler.

There are several steps involved in the removal/installation process. Fr. Kerper's existing confessional will be removed, and then the electrical and flooring work for the new confessional completed. The removal and installation process is expected to take about 2 weeks to complete. **Fr. Kerper will hear daily confessions in Fr. Healey's confessional during construction.** Thank you for your patience during construction.

The King's Battlefield

In 1925, Pope Pius XI created the feast of Christ the King. He did so to encourage Catholics to consider the relationship between religion and politics, Church and state. Of course, much has changed since 1925, and so we must revisit some crucial questions: What is the Kingship of Christ? How does He rule? Where are the battles to be fought?

In the past, the Church actually supported the union of Church and State. As recently as the years following World War II, Catholics organized and supported explicitly Catholic parties and trade unions, most notably in Italy, Germany, and some Latin American countries like Chile. This is no longer the case, except in Germany, whose governing party still bears the name “Christian,” though only as a formality.

If Catholics do not have a party, how then do they advance the Kingship of Christ? We find an answer in a text assigned to the Divine Office for Christ the King. The text comes from a homily by Origen (185-254), a brilliant theologian based in Alexandria, Egypt. Living as he did before the legalization of the Church in 313, Origen proposed that citizenship in the Kingdom of God was very different from political citizenship. He made three key points.

First, the Kingdom of God will *never* assume the form of any type of political entity. There will never be a “Christian caliphate.” For sure, in the past some countries such as Spain, Portugal, France, and Britain had states closely intertwined with the Church. Such arrangements were temporary and frequently impeded the proclamation of the Gospel through bad example.

Second, the individual believer is the true “territory” of Christ’s Kingdom. Origen wrote: *“The kingdom of God does not come in such a way as to be seen... because the kingdom of God is within us.”* This means that true citizens are *not* those who vaguely self-identify as Christians because of ethnicity or custom. Rather, the true citizens are *saints!* Origen wrote: *“Every saint is subject to God’s reign and obeys the spiritual laws of God who dwells in him as a well-governed city.”*

Third, the “warfare” that advances and defends Kingship of Christ is *spiritual*, not political or military. Origen pointed out that the central “battlefield” exists within each Christian believer. He described the warfare this way: *“We must put to death what is earthly in us so that God may walk in us and reign alone in us with his Christ.”*

In the midst of a chaotic and frightening world situation, many good Catholics waste much time debating about political and military responses. Such a focus generates useless anger, sinful hatred, and even despair – the very sentiments that truly endanger our Christian faith. Worse still, the political/strategic focus always pulls us away from the only “battlefield” that we can actually control -- our own individual souls.

Origen concluded his text with a short prayer so appropriate for our troubled times: *“May God reign over us and may we live even now amid the blessings of rebirth and resurrection. Amen.”*
