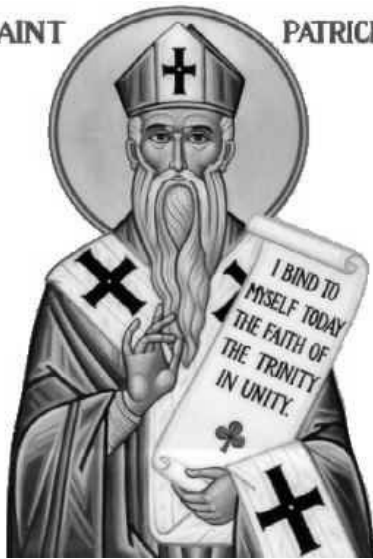

Papal drinking water

After Pope Francis had addressed the United States Congress on September 28, Representative Robert Brady of Philadelphia took possession of a glass of water that the Holy Father had touched to his lips.

“I saw him [the Pope] drink from that glass three times,” Brady said. “And I kept saying to myself, ‘I’m getting that glass.’ I didn’t steal it. I asked the sergeant at arms if I could have it. It was just going back into a dishwasher. I got a vial of the water with me right now.”

Since then, Congressman Brady has allowed various people, including a television cameraman, to bless themselves with the water. His granddaughter, named Serena, was very enthusiastic about the “holy” water: “All my friends think it’s the coolest thing that [my grandfather] took that glass.”

This rather strange episode demonstrates the survival of a form of Catholic superstition that separates “holy things” from genuine faith. Congressman Brady, who is indeed a baptized Catholic, seems to believe that the water from the Pope’s glass has some sort of miraculous power derived from its contact with the Holy Father. While Congressman Brady clearly values the Pope as a “holy thing” with possible “holy powers,” he definitely does not embrace the Holy Father’s clear teaching about the essential dignity of innocent human life. Indeed, his record in Congress is quite clear.

We have here, then, a tragic example of the reduction of the Catholic faith to a set of “things” or “traditions” valued by people who do not actually believe or live according to Catholic faith.

This superstitious form of Catholicism appears in other ways as well. For example, some people still passionately demand the administration of Baptism, Confirmation or Holy Communion to young people who clearly do not believe or do not live according to basic Catholic teaching. Why? “Because our family has always been Catholic!” Sad to say, the essential connection between “holy things” and the “substance of faith” gets lost.

Congressman Brady’s comical fascination with the Pope’s water glass reveals at least a residue of interest in the sacred. And sometimes, these “smoldering wicks” of hereditary Catholicism may blaze up into a renewed faith. However, when such superstitions pass unchallenged, those who cling to them may continue to mistake the possession of the “thing” for the “substance,” thereby never having noticed the disappearance – or complete absence – of true faith in themselves. Religious superstition is always dangerous, especially among Catholics.
