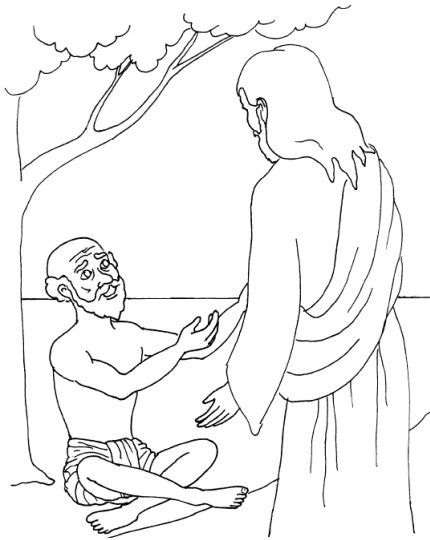

The power of religious example

Some Catholics spend much time debating the causes of the Church's noticeable shrinkage in the affluent regions of the West, including New England. Everyone has a favorite theory: fuzzy catechisms, too much tradition, not enough tradition, excessive moral strictness, too much laxity, and so forth. The real cause, however, is the bad example of professed Catholics.

Fr. Charles de Foucauld, the French hermit-priest who lived in the deserts of Algeria until his assassination in 1916, frequently stressed the absolute importance of good example as the indispensable prelude to preaching the Gospel to Muslims. In 1912, he inserted the following text into his diary: "We want good priests – not to preach – but to establish contact [with Muslims], to make themselves loved, to inspire esteem, trust, and friendship; then we should want good lay Christians of both sexes to fulfill the same role, to enter into still closer contact, to go where the priest hardly can."

Brother Charles, his preferred form of address, did not deny the obligation to preach the full truth of the Gospel. Not at all. Instead he recognized that the nomadic Tuaregs, who were Muslims, believed that all Christians were exactly like the French colonialists who controlled Algeria. These Muslims, then, equated Christian faith with the bad example of the French, who actually had no interest whatsoever in spreading the Gospel. Brother Charles, who thoroughly knew Islamic society from the "inside," believed it would take many years, even centuries, to undo the effects of bad example. He wrote: "If these unfortunate Muslims see as self-styled Christians only unjust and tyrannical speculators giving an example of vice, how can they be converted? How can they but hate our holy religion? How can they not become more and more hostile to us?" Brother Charles has been dead for 99 years. Not much has changed.

The power of good example may also act against Christian faith, drawing lukewarm and secularized Christians toward other religions. This nearly happened to de Foucauld when he was a flamboyant young surveyor living in Islamic Morocco. Having grown up in the de-Christianized France of the late 19th century, he had dropped out of the Catholic Church along with many others of his generation. When he found himself surrounded by the intense, frequent, and public worship of Muslims, he suddenly noticed the religious void in his own life. This robust Islamic worship acted like a magnet, drawing him away from Catholicism, which had become flaccid and moribund in France. This good example of widespread and enthusiastic public worship seemed to verify the truth of Islam against his hereditary Christian faith, which he scarcely knew. Reflecting on his experience of being immersed in an Islamic society, Brother Charles wrote, "And here I was without religion!"

Strange as it may seem, Brother Charles' youthful encounter with Islam played an essential role in his "re-conversion" to Catholicism. As he often said, "I live among people who pray," as opposed to secularized France. And the powerful effect of seeing praying Muslims led him to devote himself to giving good example without very much preaching at all.
