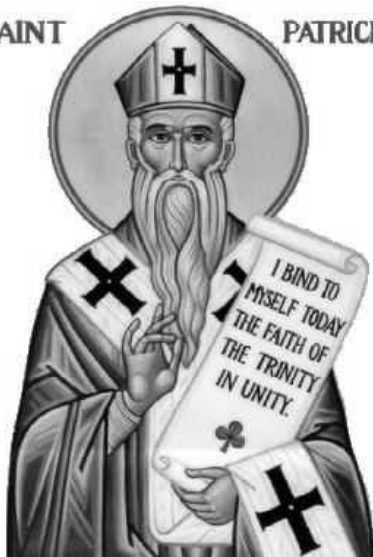

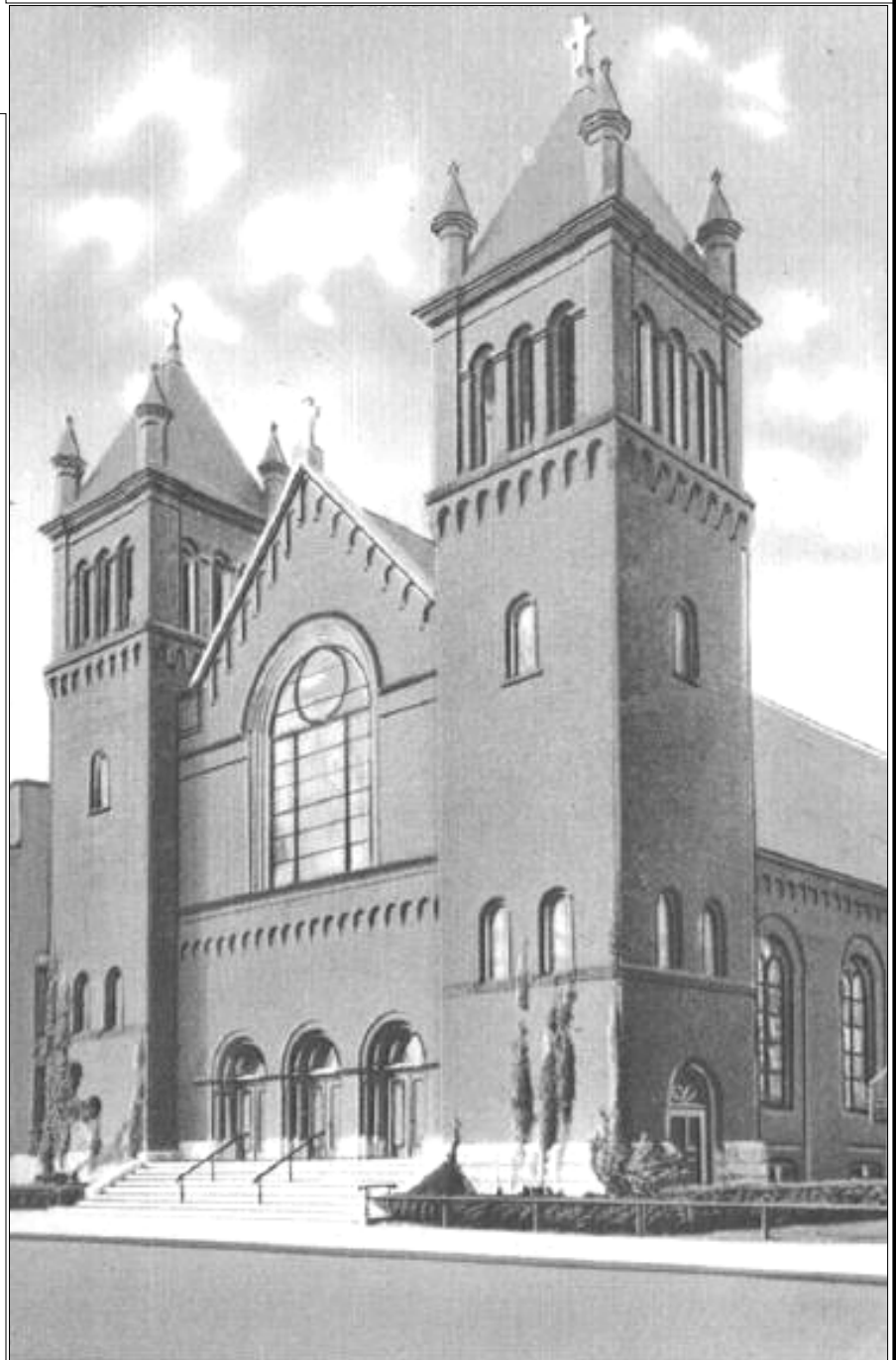

End of Year Report for 2016: Part 1

Introduction

In 2014 we started the practice of including an “End of the Year Report” with our Christmas mailing. The report serves as a helpful “catalogue” of activities and events, reminding us of the many good things that happen here at St. Patrick’s. This year’s report will appear in the bulletins for January 7/8, January 14/15, and January 21/22.

Celebrating the Eucharist

Our beautiful church exists for the worship of God. During 2016, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass was celebrated at St. Patrick Church **527** times – **212** times on Saturday evening/Sunday morning and **315** times on weekdays and Holy Days. Many people make this possible: choir members, musicians, lectors, servers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, ushers, schedulers and the wonderful women who maintain the sanctuary and launder the altar linens.

Masses at Hunt Community and Nashua Crossing

We continue celebrating monthly Masses at the **Hunt Community** and **Nashua Crossing**. Members of St. Patrick’s live at both places. About 30 people attend each Mass. We also provided the **Sacrament of the Sick** to over 100 people every Friday following the 12:05 PM Mass.

Holy Door, the Jubilee Year of Mercy, and Forgiveness

Last year Bishop Libasci designated St. Patrick Church as a special pilgrimage site for the **Jubilee Year of Mercy** proclaimed by Pope Francis. The “Holy Door,” which was blessed and formally opened last December, attracted many people from New Hampshire and Massachusetts who came to pray and receive special blessings for themselves and their deceased loved ones.

St. Patrick’s continues its long-established tradition of **frequent opportunities for Confession**. We currently have **4 hours** of scheduled Confessions every week, as well extra time before Christmas and Easter. Many people who use these opportunities are not parish members. Some come from great distances for the Sacrament. Thanks to **Fr. John Healey**, who makes himself available on Saturday and Sunday. And thanks also to **Fr. Boniface**, our guest from Nigeria, who has graciously heard many confessions in recent weeks.

Helping the poor and needy

Through the generosity of many parishioners who regularly drop money into the **Poor Box** or make other donations, our **St. Vincent de Paul Society** had over **\$35,000** available for assistance throughout the year. How blessed we are to have abundant resources to assist struggling people who pass our way. More importantly, the Society’s faithful volunteers offer compassion, kindness, and love -- always in the name of Christ, the friend of the poor.

Parish facilities used in partnerships for those in need

During late November and December, we enjoyed a partnership with the **Salvation Army**, which distributed hundreds of toys and gifts from our old school building. On September 28 we hosted “**Employment Connect**,” a job fair that made many employment opportunities known to people seeking work.

Unused Sacred Heart School

We have received multiple inquiries from different entities, such as charter schools and non-profits, about using our empty school. So far, nothing has worked out, but a group of knowledgeable parish members keep in touch with prospects. City Hall has also provided some guidance and contacts.
