Penance anyone?

During Lent we hear frequent references to *penance*. When we hear this word we usually think of something very unpleasant, something like physical or mental torture. Knowing that the Lord is kind and merciful, we wonder why He would ever delight in punishing His children. He doesn't. And so we must readjust our understanding of penance.

Penance is not torture. Rather, penance is really *medicine*. The Roman Catechism, published in 1566 after the Council of Trent, uses this beautiful image. The Catechism teaches that all sin flows from three "diseases" -- pride, lust of the flesh, and lust of the eyes. Just as different bodily diseases are treated by different medicines, so too are sins. Each requires a different "prescription." Hence, the Catechism identifies three forms of penance: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Here's how each "medicine" treats the specific sin.

First, pride emerges from an intense focus on oneself. The person afflicted by pride, the root and greatest of all sins, is totally self-absorbed and self-isolated. He or she is the center of everything. Prayer "cures" this egocentricity by turning one's gaze away from oneself to God, the great "Other." If a person commits to more time in prayer, whether alone or in public worship, the "space" for self-preoccupation begins to shrink, thereby restoring the proper relationship between "creature" and Creator.

Second, "lust of the flesh" means that "fleshy appetites" completely drive a person's life. As human beings, we need to eat, keep warm, and have loving relationships that generate new life. Hence, our attraction to material things is good. But frequently these attractions become wildly disordered even to the point of destructive "disease."

Fasting acts as the "antidote" to "lust of the flesh." How so? When we fast we rediscover our God-given ability to consume *only what we need*. By fasting, we affirm a crucial truth: we are not enslaved to our appetites. Fasting, then, allows us to experience freedom.

Third, "lust of the eyes" refers to the tendency to see many nice things and to try to possess them all. Living as we do in a consumerist society, we are bombarded by appeals to buy all sorts of products that are constantly updated, improved, and so on.

Almsgiving is the "medicine" for "lust of the eyes" because when we freely divest ourselves of some of our resources we curtail the excessive accumulation of "stuff." Moreover, we refocus our eyes, seeing human beings, especially those in need, rather than things to acquire. Almsgiving is also inseparably linked to fasting: the food not eaten is meant to be transferred to the hungry.

These three penitential "medicines" are all closely interrelated because the three "diseases" are also connected to one another. Full health requires the simultaneous treatment of all the diseases.

Of course, contemporary people, even devout Catholics, recoil from the notion that they're spiritually sick. Penance? Me? I'm just fine. Not really.

Pope Francis, when he assumed the chair of St. Peter, described the Church as a "field hospital" filled with sick and wounded people. How true! As a field hospital, the Church is also a place of healing. As such, She has abundant "medicine" -- prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, the great traditional remedies of Mother Church.
