Why veils?

At times, we Catholics practice strange customs without knowing why. One such custom is covering the crucifix and statues in purple veils from the Fifth Sunday of Lent until Holy Saturday afternoon. People of a certain vintage will recall that this was always done. Suddenly in the mid-1960's it stopped. Now, the purple veils are back, at least in some churches. Here's what happened. In the 1960's some reformers asserted that the old practice had become obsolete. Each national conference of bishops was permitted to allow it or ban it. Our conference decided to "suppress" the custom. However, about 20 years ago, the custom -- still unauthorized -- gradually crept back. The bishops decided to allow each parish to make its own decision. Three years ago we decided to return to the old practice of covering all the statues. But what's the purpose?

Liturgical historians offer multiple reasons. Let's consider just one: the desire to eliminate all visual distractions during the yearly remembrance of Christ's Passion and Death.

Long before the arrival of powerful visual stimuli, such as movies, HDTVs, video games, and computer screens, Catholic churches were usually the only places that had high quality paintings and sculpture. Indeed, many great artists survived because the Church employed them to produce great art. At first, the Church began to cover only the spectacular ornate crosses that rested on the altars. Eventually, *every* image became veiled. Even though these images depicted Christ, the Blessed Mother, saints, and sacred events, they were covered in order to focus all attention on the Passion and Death of Christ. There was to be no competition with the Passion.

For contemporary Catholics, then, the veils symbolize the need to push aside all distractions during "Passiontide" -- the period from the Fifth Sunday of Lent until Easter.

In a world filled with so much noise and constant visual stimulation, perhaps we should drop purple veils over our HDTVs and computer screens from March 22 until April 5. The wisdom and devotion of our ancient ancestors in the faith, who came up with the purple veils, deserves imitation today.
