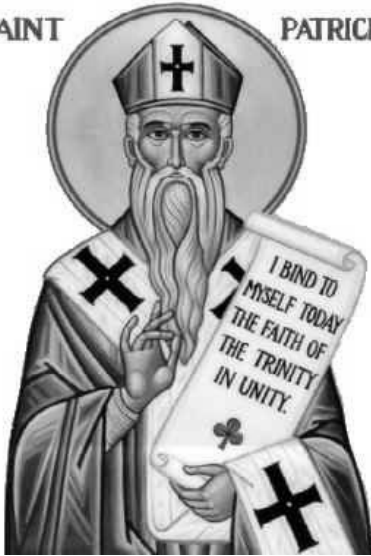

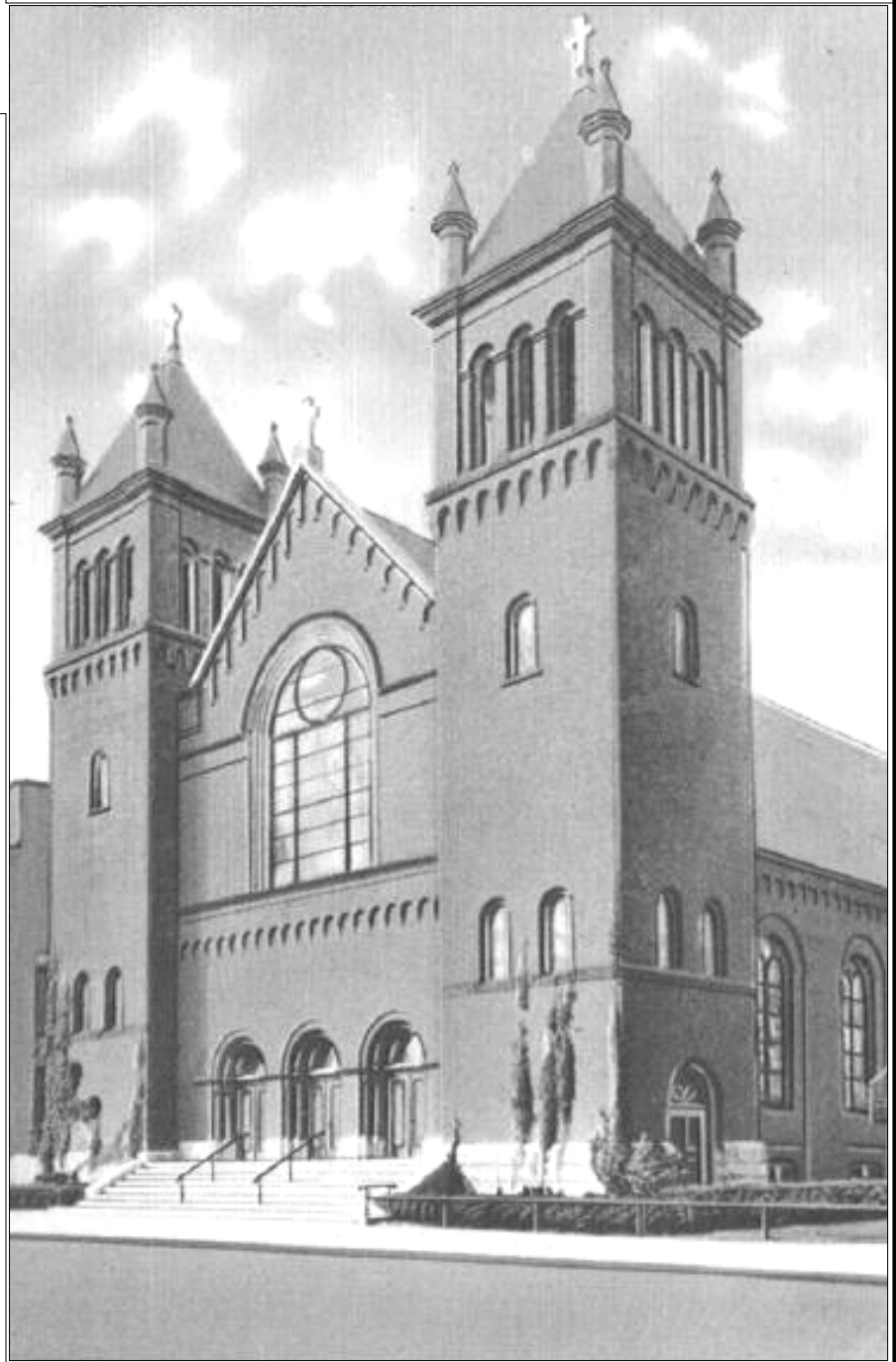

Religious identity: Who cares?

On February 25, The Boston Globe carried an op-ed piece by Jeff Jacoby about the religious identity of public figures, notably the President. Jacoby cited a study done by the Pew Research Center in 2012. Amazingly, 36% of American voters didn't know the religious identity of President Obama (he's a baptized member of the United Church of Christ/Congregationalist); and 33% didn't know Mitt Romney's religion (he's a Mormon).

This rather widespread lack of knowledge about the religious affiliations of key public figures reflects two powerful trends on our society: the *privatization* and *dilution* of religious identity.

Privatization means the enforced habit of not asking anyone about their beliefs -- and not revealing one's own affiliation to anyone else. This trend is closely linked with the widespread expectation that a person's religious beliefs will not -- and should not -- ever influence his or her decisions about anything, especially public policy. This, of course, assumes that any position taken by a religious person is somehow "superstitious" or "sectarian" and therefore unworthy of consideration by enlightened and rational people, i.e. those who don't take religion seriously. In effect, this excludes advocating any rational position that also happens to exist within any religious tradition. For example, protecting the unborn and terminally ill is excluded because the historic Judeo-Christian tradition opposed abortion and mercy killing. If religious beliefs make no real difference in how people act in the moral realm, why worry about anyone's religion? Ultimately it doesn't matter. This is why over a third of the electorate in 2012 didn't think to ask about either candidate's religion.

The second relevant trend here is the *dilution* of religious identity. Today, many people who still tenaciously cling to a religious label don't know, don't believe, or don't follow the doctrines of their own religion. Consider Catholics. The fact that a person claims to be Catholic is no guarantee that he or she actually believes what the Catholic Church believes. Over time, almost all religious "tags" -- Catholic, Buddhist, whatever -- have become less reliable indicators of belief and practice. If the "tags" don't tell us much, why bother searching for them? As a result, many have stopped looking for them.

Of course, this dilution of religious identity is not entirely new, just more widespread. St. Augustine spotted it all the way back in the 4th century. Writing in 390, he lamented the existence of "carnal Catholics," those who were joined to the Church "in the flesh" through family or tribal ties but who believed -- and did -- nothing. St. Augustine urged the Church patiently to tolerate these "carnal Catholics" while the Lord separates the chaff from corn on the threshing floor. "On this floor," he wrote, "everyone voluntarily makes himself either corn or chaff." He warned that many "carnal Catholics" eventually dispense with any religious identity "for they could be neither corrected nor endured."

Because our Catholic identity has been so closely linked with ethnicity, we constantly face the danger of being merely "carnal Catholics," people who have a religious "tag" that perhaps means less and less in our society.
