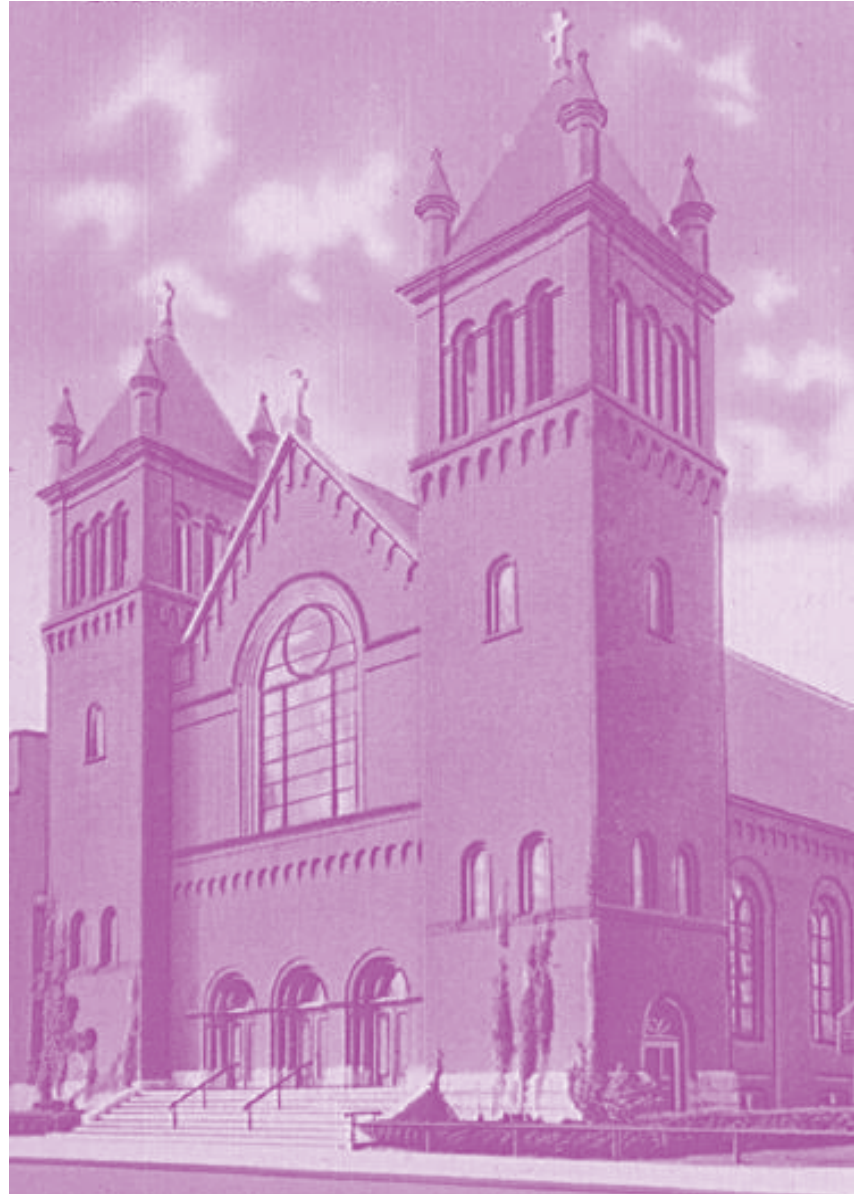

The anonymity of St. Joseph

Generally speaking, most of us want to be known by name. We tend to resent anonymity because it makes us invisible and forgettable, reducing us to “non-persons,” faceless objects sunk in the mass of the human herd. In light of this, the almost complete absence of St. Joseph’s name from the public worship of the Catholic Church seems very surprising, perhaps even offensive. However, his anonymity actually reveals a brilliant quality of his saintly character: his willingness to be used.

Consider his anonymity. The opening prayer used in the old Latin Missal for his feast day (March 19) never mentions his name at all. Instead, it begins with the words “Sanctissimae Genetricis,” which mean “Of the Most Holy Mother of God.” Here the image of the Blessed Mother completely eclipses St. Joseph even on his own feast. This peculiar arrangement of the Latin words is quite deliberate, emphasizing that St. Joseph’s greatness arises from his spousal relationship to Mary, not from himself. In turn, Mary’s greatness flows from her relationship with the Son of God. This, of course, runs contrary to the longstanding cultural practice of brides taking the surnames of their husbands, which indicates the priority of the man. In the case of St. Joseph and the Blessed Mother, the arrangement is reversed, even to the point of St. Joseph losing his name in his feast day prayer.

This anonymity of St. Joseph pervades the old Latin liturgy. Two ancient Latin prayers – the Confiteor and Sancta Trinitas – are filled with the names of saints; but St. Joseph is absent. Indeed, his name never appeared in any of the ordinary Mass texts until 1962 when Pope John XXIII finally inserted his name in the Roman Canon. [Note: Last year Pope Francis inserted St. Joseph’s name in all the Eucharistic Prayers. This change had been proposed and approved by Pope Benedict before his retirement.]

St. Joseph’s anonymity offers great consolation and affirmation to the many good and holy people who never get thanked, recognized, or remembered by anyone. This happens frequently in the Church.

As the gospels show so clearly, St. Joseph never resented “being used” – and this happened to him repeatedly: he provided Jesus with his Davidic identity, he never had the privilege of being his biological father, and he acted as the “custodian” of the household, working as a tradesman in order to provide food, clothing, and shelter. Moreover, it is unlikely that he lived long enough to see his adopted son in public ministry.

Though Sacred Scripture tells us almost nothing about St. Joseph, we can safely assume that he never resented his anonymity. In fact, perhaps he even rejoiced in it, instinctively trusting in the words that his adopted son would eventually utter: “And your Father who sees in secret will repay you” (cf. Mt 6:1-6, 16-18).
