Choosing the lesser evil?

With ever greater frequency, New Hampshire's political parties present voters with competing candidates for Governor and Senator who all agree on one point: they support legalized abortion. Faced with the absence of a candidate who convincingly upholds the rights of unborn children, what are we to do?

Some Catholics, of course, immediately embrace the strategy of "choosing the lesser of two evils." This approach, which seems so reasonable, actually departs from Catholic moral teaching. Pope Saint John Paul II reinforced this point in his monumental encyclical, The Splendor of Truth (1993). He included this clear statement from Pope Blessed Paul VI: "*It is never lawful, even for the gravest of reasons, to do evil that good may come of it*" (cf. #82).

While doing evil is always wrong, the Church teaches that at times a person may *tolerate* a specific evil or perform a good act that has some evil side effects. For example, parents could offer shelter to an adult child who was engaged in evil behavior, say, habitual drug abuse. By doing so they would not be supporting drug use but maintaining contact with the child with the hope of helping him or her recover. Likewise, a person can perform a good act, say, driving a car to the supermarket to buy food. This good act, however, has some evil outcomes: polluting the air, the possibility of running over a biker, and so forth. The good outweighs the evil side effects.

The act of voting involves us in "doing" good or evil. By giving a candidate our vote we make it possible for him or her to acquire political power, which he or she can use for good or evil. Through our vote, we then share in the good or evil done by the elected official. Of course, as everyone knows, elected officials frequently say one thing and do another. Hence, if we vote for people who say they are pro-life and who latter support, say, a Supreme Court nominee who is not, we do not share in their decision. Rather, we have been simply misled.

In the case of legalized abortion, all leading candidates for governor and U. S. Senator have made their positions quite clear: they all claim to be "pro-choice," which means they support legalized abortion. Of course, some candidates are worse than others, but all steadfastly cling to the "pro-choice" label, which means that they accept in principal that the lives of most unborn children should not be legally protected. The situation resembles the 19th century debate over slavery. Imagine if a candidate had stated that he favored freeing slaves over the age 50 while keeping the others in shackles. We could say he was "less evil" than other proponents of slavery but we wouldn't call him an abolitionist. He would not deserve support from anti-slavery citizens.

What is one to do in the voting booth? Many questions have no clear answer. For example, if a "pro-choice" candidate receives the votes of people who defend the rights of the unborn, will he or she, if elected, consider arguments for changing the status quo? Or will he or she rest assured that voters who support the rights of the unborn have finally learned to "compromise" and will now be more "comfortable" choosing "the lesser evil" in subsequent elections. Who knows? We can only guess.

Fortunately, our electoral system still has the secret ballot and respects the right of conscientious citizens to step aside from all evil, whether "greater" or "lesser." Though we have a serious obligation to vote, we are never compelled to violate our conscience. Pray, ponder, listen, vote.
