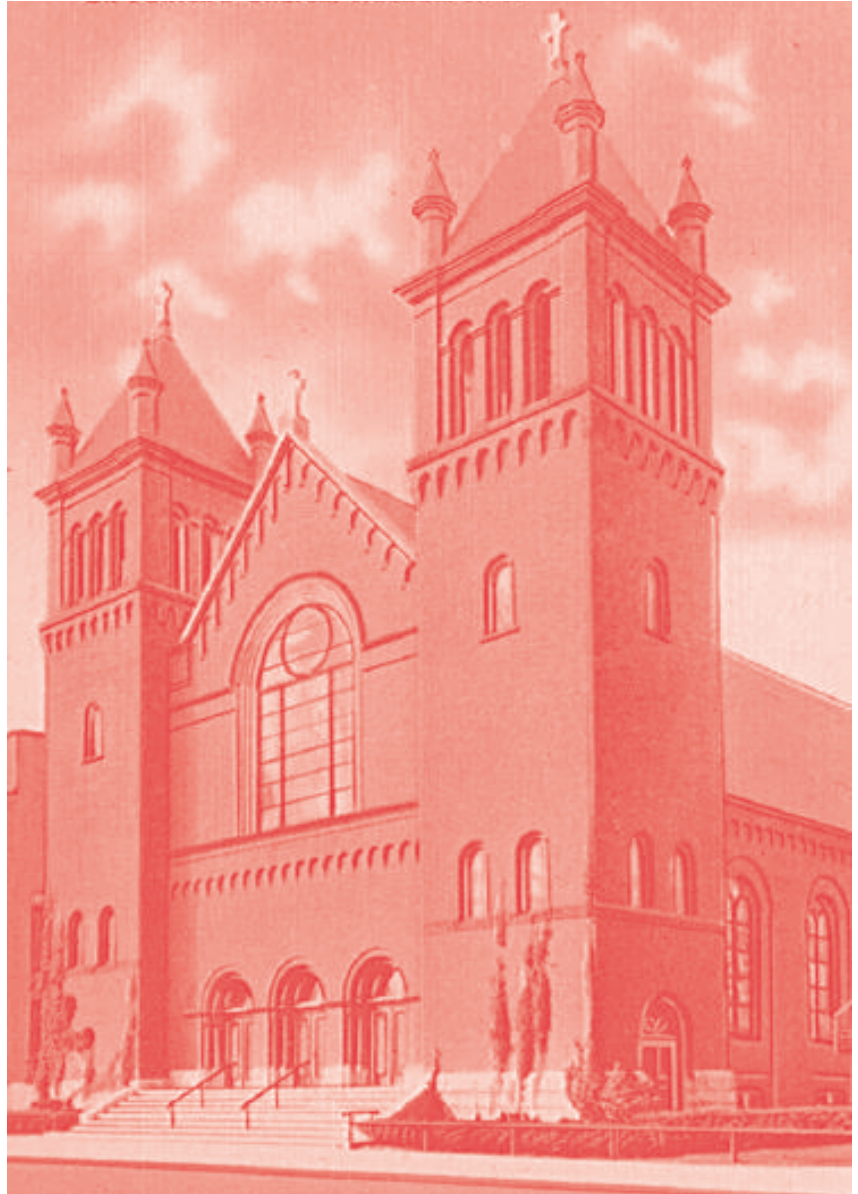

Decapitation: Political Violence Against the Innocent

The recent executions of James Foley and Steven Sotloff, two innocent journalists, at the hands of the so-called Islamic State sickened everyone. To make matters worse, they suffered death by decapitation, an act that seems especially cruel and grossly repulsive. And surely it is. Yet we must sadly acknowledge that many throughout history have chosen to behead innocent people as a way to make "religious/political" statements in and through this form of execution. The cases of St. John the Baptist and St. Thomas More, both of whom suffered martyrdom through decapitation, provide deeper understanding about this horrible practice.

Consider St. John the Baptist, whose beheading is commemorated on August 29. Sacred Scripture indicates that beheading was an accepted practice within Israel. For example, in II Kings 6:31-32 Elisha the prophet mentioned that King Ahab clearly intended to have him beheaded. In 2 Samuel 5-14, Joab, King David's general, offered to behead a man who had cursed and pelted the king with dirt. Though no one was actually beheaded, these cases indicate that the *threat* of beheading was meant to deter religious/political attacks on kings. Moreover, recall that David immediately beheaded the corpse of Goliath and displayed his severed head to the Philistine army, which immediately fled (cf. I Samuel 17:50). In this case, Goliath suffered beheading because he had offended Yahweh, the King of Kings.

As to St. John the Baptist, he suffered beheading because he had publicly denounced King Herod's illegal marriage with Herodias, his sister-in-law. Though Herod did not want to execute St. John, Herodias certainly did. Beheading was chosen to signal to the masses that St. John had offended the ruler. The violent separation of the head, the "container" of the mind, from the body was meant to symbolize the intellectual nature of the "crime."

We can see a great kinship between St. John the Baptist and St. Thomas More, who was beheaded in 1535 under the authority of King Henry VIII, a man once given the title "Defender of the Faith" by the Pope. Like St. John, St. Thomas More had committed a "political/intellectual crime," namely his adamant refusal to acknowledge the invalid marriage of the King. Here, Henry VIII simply followed the practice introduced 500 years earlier by William the Conqueror, who had reserved beheading exclusively for "high ranking men" who had committed political offenses, not ordinary crimes. In the case of St. Thomas More, his most brilliant and wise head -- the "source" of his crime -- needed to be severed from his body and grotesquely displayed for all to see.

England, by the way, continued to behead political offenders until 1747; and as late as 1820, the English continued to decapitate "traitors" who had been hanged. Moreover, until the end of World War II the legal codes of many West European nations still permitted beheading. Today, of course, Europe has banned capital punishment entirely.

For sure, Herod and Henry VIII appeared victorious over St. John the Baptist and St. Thomas More. But these two innocent victims became the true victors. Innocent people like James Foley and Steven Sotloff who suffer beheading today are at least in good company. And so we pray and hope for peace; we look again for the triumph of innocence over barbarism.
